 - Trafficking in persons is a serious crime and a grave violation of human rights. Every year, thousands of men, women and children fall into the hands of traffickers.

- Communication between the private sector, human services agencies, and law enforcement is a key component in the effort to combat this hideous crime.
 - Learn indicators as well as questions to ask the victim along with who and where to report the information.

 - **Suspicious Activity Report – Intelligence Analyst Megan Sands**
 - The world in which we live is rapidly changing around us, and in order to keep each other safe, we must adapt to current circumstances. To better protect our communities from criminal acts as well as domestic and international terrorist attacks, it is everyone’s responsibility to identify unusual or suspicious behavior.
 - In 2017, the Pennsylvania State Police Critical Infrastructure/Key Resource Unit has set a goal to reach as many citizens as possible in reference to Suspicious Activity Reporting.
 - Suspicious activity reporting continues to be the best defense against such attacks and it is one of the greatest means for developing resilience. A partnership between the private sector and law enforcement is essential to the success of anti-terrorism efforts and criminal activity prevention.
- **Pennsylvania State Police**
 - **Active Shooter – Lt. John Yunk**
 - The presentation is designed to cover all venues, including but not limited to, commerce, education, open spaces, places of worship, and public settings.
 - By discussing the different mental strategies, as well as response tactics, individuals will be better prepared to not only ACT, but REACT during an active shooter event. Discussion covers associated behaviors, thoughts, and feelings, which may be indicators that someone is disgruntled at their job, in their personal life, or with society. Triggering events that may cause individuals to become an active shooter are also discussed.
 - Active shooter statistics, trends, and real incidents are discussed, along with why it is vitally important for individuals to have a plan.
