Monthly Meeting 3rd Monday

November 21, 2006

President Skip Rupert called the regular monthly meeting of the York County Fire Chiefs and Firefighters Association to order and led the pledge to the flag. There were twenty-two people in attendance. President Rupert introduced Forrest Nace from Firehouse Software. Forrest answered questions and gave a brief overview of how the Firehouse Software Utility for CAD works. Forrest said that successful interfaces to the New World CAD System are currently running in Cleveland, Cayuga Falls, and Kent Ohio. Each department must make their own arrangements through Firehouse, to purchase the utility and have it installed. They must also have a way to connect to the internet. The County has provided the Firehouse Interface to CAD.

Minutes from the previous meeting were approved as published.

President Rupert asked for a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report Chief Shank made the motion, seconded by Chief Joe Stevens. Motion carried.

BOARD OF GOVERNORS: Barry Myers reported on the following items:

- Purchasing bleachers (with an alternate funding source)
- Burn Building met with the Township and received the go ahead. Still need to follow up with a few people yet.
 - Chief Senft reported that the Board is still working on funding sources such as Senator Wahl, County Commissioners, and Art Gladfelter. He will also be meeting with the County Commissioners on Monday to discuss the Fire School operating budget.
- Departments may be solicited by the Boy Scouts regarding the Memorial Project.

RADIO COMMITTEE: Chief Shank reported that Fire Marshall 1 (PSP Fire Marshall), Duty Officer 5 & Duty Officer 2, and Boat 63 were approved.

- The follow up email on the radio purchases will not be occurring per an email from Eric Bistline. Most departments have met with Bob Fasick and signed off on their totals recently.
- Base stations on the new radio system each department will be responsible to license them.
 - Rob Bissey stated it may behoove us to license all stations in the County on one license –
 even those who have no base station at this time. Who will cover the Municipal EOC's
 licenses?
- Go live was a decent turnover, bear with the changes, If you need something changed contact Cindy or Brandy at 911.

COMMUNICATIONS: None

911: Audrey Rychalsky reported that CAD was up and running. The staff is working through some errors at this time. If there is a problem with your responses make someone aware.

FIRE SCHOOL: Carl Avery, Program Coordinator, submitted the following report.

SR60 will go back to square one. The recommendations will stand, but it will need to be reintroduced in 2007.
- Chief Senft said that York City Fire will be hosting classes for ICS 200. There will be four offerings of the class in January, breakfast and lunch is included. No charge for the class.
- Chief Shank stated he has 7000 gallons of AFFF Foam that has been donated. He is looking for skids. He is also looking to start up a foam taskforce and would be placing the skids at strategic locations throughout the County.
