CALL TO ORDER (President Chad Deardorff)

PRESENTATIONS

Commissioner Wheeler here and spoke about the volunteer tax rebate and looking for feedback. She said she knows its not the answer but hoping it's a help.

Some feedback that it is helping local municipalities but the school boards still not willing to support. Julie willing to come out and support in person.

DCNR discussed about wildland fires and responding forest fires. Fire wardens have the power put out fire and assist any fire that is not involving a structure and to make a report and recording the expenses.

The role pf the DCNR staff would be to support with technical knowledge. They have specialized crews to support if needed.

Some resources available can be aircraft and / or heavy equipment.

If an outside brush and gets to a structure, it is DCNR. What is it's a structure fire that gets into the brush. DCNR can assist with resources while still supporting the structure portion.

How does it work since the local municipality is the authority having jurisdiction, they rely heavily of the request of the county / local fire chiefs, etc.

They are not here to take over but to support the local departments.
