CALL TO ORDER (President Chad Deardorff)

President Chad Deardorff called the monthly meeting of the York County Fire Chiefs and Firefighters Association to order at 1900 hours. The call to order was followed by a pledge to the flag and a moment of silence. 37 people were in attendance.

PRESENTATIONS

Commissioner Wheeler spoke about tax rebate. It is a little clunky right now but will be updating, need for notary will be eliminated, and a copy of utility bill (for those who have multiple properties) will be eliminated also. Must follow the resolution from 2022 for this year.

After March 20, new resolution will be posted.

Julie met with all 17 school superintendents and was very encouraging / strong request to implement the

school tax rebate. She will be meeting with all school board presidents also. Her message was, without volunteers, no one will respond to help you.

Introduced Clair Doll who is the deputy clerk, who is currently supporting the 911 center for senior leadership support, not taking interim director role.

Clair spoke about his role, not acting director of 911. There to help the current deputy directors with their administrative stuff. Also, commented on how can 911 provide better customer service. How do we get things moving forward and set up the new director for success.

Chad thanked Julie and Clair for attending tonight. Its been a long time sine the person overseeing 911 has attended.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

REPORTS

Treasurer (Bob Bowman):

Treasurer Bob Bowman presented the following report: Beginning balance \$20,759.54 with an ending balance of \$35,951.40. President Deardorff asked for a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. Scott Gingerich made a motion, Eric Strittmatter seconded the motion and the motion was approved.

Board of Governors (Chad Deardorff – **BOG@group.ycfs.us**):

The Board met this evening prior to this meeting and discussed several items, some of which included student issues. One student that was in a class and the boyfriend showed up at an instructor's house and made a perceived threat. Talked about PA making / implementing a code of conduct policy. HACC was going to implement but, YCFS plans to implement out own policy. Will be listed on the website and the leader of the department will need to acknowledge it for the student. Then there will be a session at the very beginning of the class, before anything else.

RAK-P grant request for municipal support still in the process. Chief Hoff received support from many senators and representatives.

OTHER AGENCY REPORTS

911 Center/YCDES (Clair Doll):

Tony Myers asked about the pull of two engines from a single station. That is a change since Jan 1. FP calls, on the second call, primary station is getting skipped. What's the Crewforce and WebView update? Clair advised that he was asked to address the Crewforce and WebView issue. Team is working on shortterm and long-term plan. Working with team to enter a different way so the info only goes into the PD side. Second possibility, long-term, have vendor reset and start fresh. Regarding the FP concern, that came up in the center and he will follow up. He also advised that there needs to be better customer service. Calling directly and making a verbal contract.

John Woods stated that they put in a ticket about a water main break. Got an email back and didn't like the reply and then asked to be escalated and then received a call, days to weeks later that PD gets them but not on the notifications for the FD.

Brad Dunham asked to be notified if CAD is down. Don't hide it, notify us.

Eric Strittmatter asked to know why under emergency phase conditions are put out, No reason in the page. Under emergency conditions, will take pole info form PD but not FD.

Concern over not dispatching FD and only PD on many things that should have FD.

Tony reiterated that if there is an issue, a inquiry MUST be filed to start the process.

Questions about paging, is the process still happening to split the voice paging off of the CAD so if digital paging goes down, the voice paging will work.

ATR (John Sanford - <u>vc.atr@comcast.net</u>):

The ATR team had 2 calls for the month; 2 calls for the year.

<u>OEM</u> (Bill James):

Not present. Actively interviewing for Cody's replacement.

Haz-Mat (Dan Santoemma):

The Haz-Mat team had 12 calls for the month; 24 calls for the year. 184 incidents in 2023

Will be performing some classes involving electric cars coming up soon

Fire Police (Bud Yohe):

If you are planning an activity and need FP from elsewhere, the municipality must ask for permission and be approved by the sending municipality.
