President Deardorff asked for a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. Larry Anderson made a motion, Phil Golden seconded the motion and the motion was approved.


<u>Board of Governors</u> (Chad Deardorff – <u>BOG@group.ycfs.us</u>):

Minimum Unit Type Definitions and Minimum Requirements:

Engine

- Pump: ≥ 1000 gpm (must have current pump test)
- Water Tank: ≥ 300 gal
- Hose: minimum 800' dual 3" or 800' > 4" Hose
- Hose: minimum 400' of 1 ½", 1 ¾", or 2"
- Biannual pump test certification Inspection by YCFC&FA Organization.
- Ladders: (1) Extension, (1) Roof, (1) Attic or Combination

Truck

- Aerial ladder or platform ≥ 75' or greater (must be certified-YCFC&FA Organization Inspection Bi Annual w/ Certification)
- Ladders: minimum 115', including at least (2) extension, (2) roof, (1) Attic or Combination
- Ventilation Fan (positive or negative pressure)
- Minimum of (1) one chain saw
- Minimum of (1) one rotary saw

Tanker

- Water Tank: ≥ 1800 gal
- Quick dump (gravity or jet-assist, direct discharge from tank) on all (3) three sides
- Minimum of (1) one porta tank \geq water tank capacity (Maximum Porta Tank size require 3500 Gallons)

Rescue

• Must comply with the requirements for Rescue established by the Rescue Committee and/or be certified under the PA DOH/OSFC program

Heavy Rescue – *Unit Type designation only

- Must comply with the requirements for Heavy Rescue established by the Rescue Committee and/or be certified at the Vehicle & Machinery Advanced level under the PA DOH/OSFC program
- Should check both Rescue AND Heavy Rescue Unit Types

Brush

- 4 x 4 chassis
- MAXIMUM GVWR: 19,500lbs
- Pump: ≥ 100 gpm
- Water Tank: ≥ 150 gallons
- Minimum of two discharges (at least one 1" or larger)
- Minimum of 400' of 1" hose
- Minimum of two (2) Indian style tanks (metal or soft side bladder)
- Minimum of two (2) forestry rakes
- UTV/ATV do not get brush designation
- Minimum of 1 Chain saw ≥ 16 " bar
- Minimum of 1 Leaf blower

Mobile air supply/SCBA cylinder refill capability, minimum five (5) 6000psi cylinder banks

York County Fire Chiefs & Firefighters Association

Service or Utility – *Unit Radio designation only

• Any vehicle designed for fire ground support purposes, not otherwise classified, primarily intended for hauling of equipment (Examples: pickup, cargo van, utility body truck)

Car – *Unit Radio designation only

• Any vehicle designed primarily for personnel transport (Example: SUV, passenger van, sedan)

Traffic

• Meets requirements established for traffic control units by York County Fire Police Assn.

Foam

• Unit or trailer equipped to carry and deliver mass-quantities of class A or B firefighting foam

Collapse

• Specialized rescue vehicle equipped for structure collapse, trench rescue, etc., part of recognized Technical Rescue team.

Battalion

• Fire Department supervisor in a career fire department consisting of 3 or more stations.

Warden

• Appointed Forest Fire Warden recognized by PA DCNR.

Personnel Designations

- Individuals communicating via radio may be referred to using their rank, riding position, or the designation "portable". These are radio identifiers only, not all will be listed units in CAD.
- Only Chief Officers will have associated Units in the Cad system. Lower-ranking officers such as Captains and Lieutenants will be logged in CAD using the "Duty Officer ##" generic unit for the station.

The County's guidelines would be applicable for real estate tax purposes. However, we begin receiving individual earned income tax returns in January, and just like employer W-2 withholding information, we need to have your information in hand by the end of January so that we can process the requested credits when the forms are processed. If we do not have the credit list in hand we cannot give the credit.

YATB is not part of the County government. While we can't mandate that you get the lists to us by the end of January, it is VERY helpful to have them sooner rather than later. Every year I send out multiple emails to various municipalities who forget to send us their lists. Many do not send them to us even by March 31. This causes a real delay when processing firefighter tax returns, and in some cases we have had to deny the credits requested.

I am sure that many FD's in the county are following the document online and I would like to clarify the due date that we are supposed to follow. I serve on the board for the YC Fire Chiefs Association and am hoping I can help clear up any discrepancy in the due dates for our fire service leaders who are most likely the ones that will be completing those tasks.

Subject: Volunteer Firefighter Credit

Hello!

I wanted to send a note to all the YATB membership regarding Volunteer Firefighter Credit. As you know, PA Act 172 of 2016 allows municipalities and school districts to provide a tax credit to their qualifying volunteers in their local fire companies as an incentive for their service. The credit can be applied to their Earned Income Tax or their Real Estate Tax, depending on how the local ordinance is written. The amount of the credit varies per ordinance.

To date a number of our member municipalities and school districts have enacted the credit and it has presented YATB with significant challenges to process these credits correctly, for a number of reasons. I am asking for your assistance going forward so that we can make sure your volunteers receive the credit they are entitled to in a timely manner. You can help us by doing the following:

- If your taxing authority has recently enacted the VFF credit or plans to do so before the end of 2024, if you have not already done so, please provide us a copy of your ordinance/resolution AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. We cannot issue credits to your volunteers until we have your ordinance in hand and can program our system accordingly. Since these ordinances vary so much, we must enter the specifics of the ordinance into our tax processing software manually for each one.
- We cannot process <u>any</u> credits for your volunteers until you send us your list of approved fire company members and the amount of credit for which they are eligible. Please send us your list **NO LATER THAN JANUARY 30** each year. Again, we have to manually enter each volunteer's credit figure into our system so that the credit can be applied to their tax return. <u>NOTE: ONLY THOSE FIRE COMPANY MEMBERS WHO ARE RESIDENTS OF YOUR TAXING AUTHORITY CAN RECEIVE A CREDIT FROM YOU.</u> There is no non-resident credit in Act 172.
- When sending your list, please include the following information: taxpayer's complete name, address, city, state, zip code, and the last four digits of their SSN. We need this information to properly identify the volunteer in our tax system.
- Each volunteer who is applying for the earned income tax credit **MUST** include a copy of the signed <u>Application for Tax Credit</u> attached to this email. Either you or the taxing authority's designated representative must sign the form authorizing the credit and the form must accompany the volunteer's tax return and other supporting documents before the credit can be issued. The credit is NOT automatic; the taxpayer must properly file their annual tax return and apply the credit accordingly.
- Volunteers who are RETIRED or DISABLED and have no earned income have no earned income tax liability and therefore will receive no earned income credit. Please advise these volunteers to apply the credit to their real estate tax and to not apply to YATB for the VFF credit. YATB does not handle real estate tax except for Railroad Borough.
- If a volunteer complains that they have not received their refund due for their credit, please have them contact us. Usually this means that either (a) they did not file a tax return; (b) they did not request the credit on their tax return; (c) they did not include a copy of their VFF credit form with their tax return; or (d) their name was not listed on the list of volunteers provided by the taxing

authority. If they file a return and request the credit but are missing the VFF Credit form documentation, we will write to the taxpayer requesting a copy of the missing information before we issue their refund. There have been cases of people claiming VFF credits who are not entitled to them. We do our best to police this for you, so that is why we require documentation.

Any VFF credit applied to a volunteer's earned income tax will be funded directly from the taxing authority's future EIT revenue. Because Act 32 requires us to distribute tax withheld to our members within 30 days of remittance by the employer, individual tax returns are processed long after the tax revenue has been distributed to you. Therefore, to fund a refund to a taxpayer we must take that amount out of a future distribution of your EIT. In addition, VFF credits can ONLY be funded by the taxing authority that has adopted the credit, unlike a typical refund which is distributed evenly between the school district and the municipality.

I have also included guidance from DCED regarding the VFF Credit. Hopefully you find this information helpful to you. I will be sending out VFF credit reports shortly to those members who had the credit in place for this tax year. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Good morning,

I just got back from vacation and I am currently trying to figure out the issue with the patrol troopers and responding to the burn ban complaints. Moving forward when you get dispatched to a burn ban complaint in PSP response area, contact county and request a patrol trooper to respond to the address. If you cannot remain on scene due to an extended ETA by the trooper, that is fine. Provide your name and contact information to our dispatchers so the trooper can contact you at a later time. The troopers have been instructed from this point forward that if they are dispatched to an open burning call they shall be issuing a citation regardless of the situation. If you have any questions feel free to email me or call the station. Hopefully this now resolves the issue with our response to these fires.
