OTHER AGENCY REPORTS

911 Center/YCDES (Guy Hettinger):

The center has started working with CAD vendors, exploring the options. Only seen demos. Once they narrow down the list, they will engage Fire, Police and EMS for feedback and needs.

Issue of box maps requesting maps, Guy will be having them put them into a secure folder so everyone will be able to see them all. The goal is you won't need to put in a request for information request to see

them.

Phil Golden brought up a concern about FD being dispatched for medical assist. EMS was given additional for a dangerous scene but the info wasn't put into CAD. Can that be added?

<u>ATR</u> (John Sanford - <u>yc.atr@comcast.net</u>):

The ATR team had 6 calls for the October and November; 59 calls for the year.

OEM (Chris Weidenhammer:

The discussion regarding drones. There was a concern in Fairview Twp being low near moving vehicles. PD was involved. Lots of 911 calls regarding, 13 calls in one night. PEMA has asked that that the counties track the 911 calls and report back. County DA office is encouraging the fire service to treat any downed drone as a crime scene and a potential hazmat situation. Any questions or concerns, contact Chris Weidenhammer. Question was, is there a point at which the FAA has to be involved? Not sure. Maybe for a large sized drone versus a small sized drone. Jim Pritchard advised that this shouldn't be any different than any other aircraft.

Crane Clean Energy, formerly TMI, has a meeting with OEM in the next month, regarding the restart of the plant. They wanted to start up in 2028 but it has been pushed up to 2027 and that means the testing will need to start in 2026.

Haz-Mat (Dan Santoemma):

The Haz-Mat team had 12 calls for the month; 186 calls for the year. Met with 911 to clean up the dispatch policy regarding hazmat dispatches. HazMat Tech class April 26, 27 May 3, 4 Propane emergency class in late 2025.
